

LTBHS CONTRABAND LIST

For the safety of our patients and staff, the following items are not allowed:

CLOTHING

Shoestrings
Clothing with drawstrings, including military PT clothing
Bras with underwire
Sweatshirts with drawstrings
Hoodie style shirts
Belts
Bandanas, scarves, neckties
Overalls
Flip Flops (for shower only)
Large, heavy footwear such as boots
High Heels

JEWELRY

All jewelry, except wedding bands
Bracelets of any kind
Watches and bracelets made from Paracord
Body jewelry must be removed if possible

PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS

Razors/razor blades (adults must keep in locker; adolescents cannot have)
Nail files, clippers
Mirrors, including compacts
Aerosol cans
Body wash puffs
Shampoo and conditioner
Baby oil
Vaseline
Baby powder

TOBACCO PRODUCTS

Cans of dip (adults may keep at the nurses' station)
E-cigarettes
Lighters, matches

WEAPONS

Knives, sharp objects, ice picks, etc.
Firearms, ammunition, fireworks
Needles, sewing hooks and pins
Scissors

SUBSTANCES

Illegal substances
Drug paraphernalia
Medications (exceptions apply for certain medical situations)
Alcohol in any form, including mouthwash, nail polish remover and hand sanitizer

METAL

All metal objects
Metal cans
Eating utensils
Wire bound notebooks
Paper clips, staples
Magnets and anything containing magnets

ELECTRONICS

Cell phones
Cameras
Computers and tablets (iPods, iPads)
Any radio, electronics or anything with a cord
Anything containing batteries
Button batteries

MISCELLANEOUS

All glass items (except eyeglasses)
Ink pens
Plastic bags
Zipit Products (change purses, tote bags, pencil cases, etc.)
Polymer toy balls
Walking sticks – canes may be used if checked for contraband in hollow area
Aerosol cans
Fidget spinners/cubes
Sunglasses – unless specified by MD order per medical approval for medical diagnosis
Any similar/like additional items that treatment team deems to pose a safety threat (RN discretion)

The items listed above are not allowed with individual patients or in the milieu. This is for safety purposes for all patients. MD orders cannot supersede this list, as this could compromise patient/milieu safety.
